General appearance

The general appearance of pupils should conform to a reasonable norm, which, if necessary, shall be at the discretion of the Headmaster. Hair must be neat and tidy. Unnatural hair colouring is not permitted.

It is important that each pupil should project an image that would bring credit to himself and the School. Pupils may be sent home to change if they are dressed inappropriately and/or are not adhering to the guidance set out below.

School Uniform

Pupils are expected to be correctly attired at all times, with shirts neatly tucked in and ties done-up. This expectation applies during the school day and includes a pupil's journey to and from school.

All items **must** be clearly labelled with the pupil's full name. Watches, if worn, should have the owner's initials scratched on the back of the case for identification.

Most items of uniform are generic and may be purchased from any outlet. School branded items, or those specific to this school, are highlighted in bold. Other school branded items can be purchased and may be worn, but only the branded items highlighted in bold should be considered as essential.

- **Navy blazer with School crest**
- Plain white shirt
- **House tie (or Colours tie, Senior Prefect tie, or Sixth Form tie, as appropriate)**
- Plain charcoal grey trousers (not skinny-leg style)
- Plain charcoal grey or black socks
- Black leather or faux-leather shoes (not suede or of a trainer style)
- Charcoal grey or black V-neck jumper (optional) – Sixth Form pupils may additionally wear navy blue V-neck jumpers

Pupils should also have a warm, preferably waterproof, coat available for inclement weather and a suitably sized bag in which to carry their equipment to and from school. Please note that trainers, gym shoes, or boots are not permitted when in school uniform. Hoodies are not acceptable.

- **House T-shirt**
- White shorts
- White socks
- Trainers with non-marking sole
- Towel
- Gum shield (advised)
- Shin Pads
- Football or Rugby boots with metal safety studs, moulded plastic studs or blades
- **Reversible white/black hooped jersey (plain white on reverse)**
- Black rugby shorts
- Black rugby socks
- Black tracksuit (optional)
- Black splash top (optional)

Other items

- Lanyard and multifunction card (will be provided by the School in the first instance)
- A protective apron
- A pencil case containing: a black pen, a pencil (HB), coloured pencils, a pencil sharpener, an eraser, a ruler, a protractor, a pair of compasses, scissors, a glue stick, a scientific calculator, and a green pen for self and peer assessment activities
- A pocket-sized English dictionary (optional)
- Collins Pocket French Dictionary or Collins Easy Learning French Dictionary (optional)
- Collins Pocket German Dictionary or Collins Easy Learning German Dictionary (optional)
