

Ermysted's enjoyed another tremendous win, this time in the County Cup at home to Whitby. This game was another where we ended up running away with it but only after making a solid start. 
Picnic in the Park!

Area Cup Semi-Final Win at King James



Ermysted's qualified for this quarter-final with a bye and were drawn away to King James, Knaresborough. We played on their brand new astroturf so the pitch was great but an end to end wind spoiled the game as a footballing spectacle.

Although we were on astroturf it was very much a game of two halves as we played into a strong wind first half. We started well but soon found it hard to play the ball out and King James realised that the long clearance was going to put us under pressure. We did do well first half and played the better football but without making many chances.

King James looked a little dangerous from the long ball but our defence held firm and looked like we would go in goal-less at half-time. However, a cross from the right wing became a cracking finish as it nestled (1-0) in the far stanchion! We did have 10 minutes to weather

before the break but actually it was us that should have scored. Will M had a great game and his direct and physical presence with no little skill set up a virtually unmissable (XG 0.95) chance for Cassian C. Cass will have nightmares as he remembers skewing the ball wide from inside the six-yard box.

The half-time team talk was easy as the team had set themselves up for a win when they had the winds at our backs. Sure enough it looked like it would pan out that way as Aryaan G neatly finished following some good midfield triangles, before Mohammad U slotted a nice ball for Aryaan's goal (1-1).

We couldn't do things the easy way though as on 48 minutes we lost Tom W as he defended a corner. Something went in his knee and whilst he was on the ground groaning his team-mates failed to clear the danger and someone was left with a tap in at the far post (2-1).



We needed to reshuffle and never got back to our fluid best. In hindsight, the turning point of the match came on 62 minutes. King James dangerous right winger did well and struck a fierce shot across goal. Max was beaten but very relieved when the ball came back off the foot of the post and back the way it had come to our make shift fullback Freddie S. Freddie moved swiftly back up field and after a couple of nice passes with Cassian he set Mohammad off down the left wing. Mohammad slipped a ball inside their fullback for Aryaan to drill the ball inside the near post for a tremendous team goal (2-2).

Cassian usually a pretty reliable finisher then showed it wasn't to be his game as Mohammad once more set up a decent chance. Cassian's shot from near the penalty spot went straight into the keepers arms but it showed we were back on track. Boe K looked to have given us the

lead when Cassian turned provider but Boe's good half volley finish was given offside.



That meant 10 minutes to go and both sides pushing for the winner rather than waiting for the lottery of penalties. With just five minutes left Boe played a ball over to the inside left channel. Mohammad beat the fullback and keeper to the ball and lobbed it high towards the right side of goal. We had a great view of it but weren't sure it was going to be in or bounce over the bar. Sure enough it bounced virtually on the goal-line and into the roof of the net. A goal to grace any game and certainly a brilliant way to win this game (2-3).



A couple of minutes later we even had a cushion as we were awarded a free-kick in a dangerous position fairly central and about 25 yards out. Up stepped Jenson M and he hit a near perfect shot 'top bins' to secure the game (2-4). The three minutes left stretched to nearly ten and we could have been in bother if it weren't for Max H who caught, punched clear and made a fine save as he turned one round the post.

We now have county cup game at home to Whitby next week and a home area cup semi-final against Harrogate Grammar or Rossett. Hopefully Tom and Sam's injuries will be cleared up for the schools assault on some silverware!
